

## **Huntington Ridge Pool Rules**

- Pool hours are from 10 a.m. to dusk.
- All persons using the pool do so at their own risk.
- Children 12 and under must be supervised by an adult at all times.
- The pool, pool deck and pool facilities are non-smoking areas.
- No animals or pets allowed in the pool or pool enclosure.
- No glass in the pool area. No food, drinks or gum in the pool.
- No running, rollerblading, skateboarding, or biking on pool deck or ramps.
- No large floats, sports balls or water guns on pool deck or in the pool.
- No diving, pushing, shoving or other rough playing in pool or on deck.
- No persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs may use the pool.
- No foul or abusive language in pool area.
- Any children in diapers, pull-ups or training pants must also wear tight fitting rubber pants or waterproof diaper covers. Swim diapers alone are not appropriate. No changing diapers on the pool deck.
- All swimmers must shower before entering the pool.
- Persons with a contagious skin rash, eye, ear or nasal infection or other communicable disease may not use the pool.
- Portable CD players or stereos must be kept at moderate levels.
- In the event of thunder or lightning, please exit the pool and wait at least 30 minutes after the storm ends (last thunder clap is heard) before resuming swimming.
- A pay phone is located just inside the gate to the pool enclosure. The first aid kit is located near the pay phone.
- Be considerate of other pool users and residents at all times.
- Violation of any rules will result in suspension of pool privileges. Adult residents have the authority and responsibility to request that rule breakers leave the area. Please use your judgment and authority reasonably.

# Huntington Ridge Pool Guidelines

## POOL

The pool is for Huntington Ridge members and their accompanied guests only. A pool access keycard is required to enter the facility. If you do not have a keycard, please call CAS at 933-7144.

The pool hours are 10 a.m. to dusk.

Children 12 and under must be supervised by an adult resident at all times.

Please do not climb over the fence to get into the pool area. Use the gated entrances to enter the pool facility.

Chairs should remain upright at all times and out of the pool. Chairs and lounges tipped over to make forts can result in broken chairs. Replacing these items would cost the homeowner's money that must be taken out of our homeowner's dues.

## CHILDREN IN DIAPERS

**Children in diapers must also wear tight fitting rubber pants or waterproof diaper covers to prevent fecal contamination of the pool.** Swim diapers are not sufficient since they will not contain fecal matter. Fecal contamination of the pool poses the dangerous risk of e.coli bacteria. For the safety of all of the members of our community, please be sure to follow this important policy. **Under no circumstances should children be allowed in the pool unclothed.**

## FECAL OR OTHER CONTAMINATION OF THE POOL

If you notice evidence of fecal or other contamination (e.g., vomit), please take the initiative to evacuate the pool even if you, your child or your guest did not cause the contamination. **Immediately contact the pool management company, Triangles Pool Management, at 878-3661.**

## FLOATATION DEVICES

For the safety of our children, who may become trapped underneath, oversized flotation devices (e.g., large rafts and tubes) are **not** allowed in the pool at any time.

## NO SMOKING POLICY

Smoking in the pool area is prohibited. Please properly extinguish and neatly dispose of all smoking materials.

## **POOL AREA**

The current pool-cleaning contract includes limited monitoring of the pool, bathrooms and pool deck. Please be sure to clean up after yourself, your children, and your guests. Clean off tables, push in chairs and close the umbrellas before you leave the pool area.

## **“POOL CLOSED” SIGN**

When the “Pool Closed” sign is posted, please comply. This sign will only be posted in the off-season or in the event of contamination or if the pool cleaning company notes a problem with the pool. The pool will be closed for 24 hours after being treated for contamination. Swimming in the pool during this time is hazardous to your health. The chemicals used to shock the pool can cause damage to eyes and skin.

## **POOL RULES AND CONTACT INFORMATION**

The pool rules, posted at the pool and on the [www.casnc.com](http://www.casnc.com) website, were modeled on the rules of other local swim clubs and neighborhood pools. They were designed to ensure an enjoyable experience for all users of the pool. Please support your community by following the rules. Non-compliance may result in a warning or suspension of pool privileges.
